Novices' Hurdle, 1st Feb

12.50 PM

RW: I think Elixir D'ainay will uphold the form with Longhouse Poet at Naas over this longer trip. whether either of them is good enough to match the form shown by Paul Nolan's Latest Exhibition is another thing.

MF: **Fury Road,** if the taps are turned on and it's soft ground.

FH Longhouse Poet, who is related to horses who stay 3m plus is going to love the extra two furlongs here and should relish the test of stamina.

PP: The step up in trip will really suit Long House Poet and he looks value to me.

Arkle Novice Chase, 1st Feb

2.00 PM

RW: I expect Mark Walsh and Fakir Doudairies to make more of the running than he did at Christmas. Paul Townend has stuck with Melon purely on back-class, but Cash Back and Bapaume still have potential. Too hard to call but set up for a finisher.

MF: If **Fakir Doudairies** is ridden like he was at Fairyhouse, he may get his revenge this time.

FH: Purely from a selfish point of view I want **Notebook** to win, so we get a price about something else in the Arkle.

PP: I think **Cashback** is worth some value as he'll hopefully put some of the others jumping under pressure because he gets over them so well.

Irish Champion Hurdle, 1st Feb

RW: The one doubt I'd have about Honeysuckle is the ability to jump at speed. You have to race at Championship pace. I think the race will be set up for **Sharjah** to pounce on the run to the last flight.

MF: It wouldn't surprise me to see **Honeysuckle** win this – but it is by far and away her sternest test to date.

FH: **Sharjah** is lethal at Leopardstown and The race should set up perfectly for him.

PP: I think the conditions, everything about the race probably sets up for **Sharjah** but I'm sticking with Honeysuckle.



Dublin Chase, 1st Feb

1.25 PM

RW: We're hoping Chacun Pour Soi improves to Min's level but getting to that level isn't easy. Min is 171, has been there, done that. Simple as.

MF: I just love the way **A Plus Tard** goes through a race so he's the one for me.

FH: Min is a massive price on what he's done in his career to date and if Paul Townend picked him instead of Chacun Pour Soi, he'd be favourite.

PP: Arguably Min's form is as strong as you're gonna get in the race. I think Min might be worth a few quid.

Handicap Chase, 1st Feb

RW: The two I like against the field are Shane Nolan's **Charlie Stout** who won well at Fairyhouse last time and my Dad's horse **Batcio.** Both are at the right end of the weights and should be involved at the finish. I'm hoping Batsio wins it for my Dad.

MF: I like last year's winner Quamino trained by Paul Nolan. He's on a similar handicap mark again and is a double-digit price. His last run was over three miles, but the 2m 1f trip is more up his street.

FH: The Ted Walsh-trained **Batcio** could be one of my best bets on day one. He looks well treated to me and ran well in his first handicap start here in December.

PP: Batcio for me Bob.

Ladbrokes Hurdle, 1st Feb

RW: I can see why Paul Townend has chosen Buildmeupbuttercup. She was a little unlucky at Fairyhouse last time and could be good value. Gordon Elliott's Thatsy under Jack Kennedy caught my eye as well.

MF: Nothing really i fancy in this one and Frank is the king of the handicaps so just go with his pick.

FH: I absolutely love Tony Martin. He's a great man and has an excellent record with his runners in this race and saddles **The Mouse Doctor**. I do also like Unexpected and think it's well handicapped.

PP: Buildmeupbuttercup for me screams a bit of value, thank you.
